

# COVID-19 Declared a Public Health Emergency



An extraordinary event that constitutes a public health risk to other States through the international spread of disease

#### **AND**

potentially requires a coordinated international response

A disease or disorder **presents a public health emergency**OR


That a **public health emergency**, including significant outbreaks of infectious disease or bioterrorist attacks, **otherwise exists**



### **Symptoms of COVID-19**

- Fever
- Lower respiratory symptoms:
  - Cough
  - Shortness of Breath
  - Chills
  - Headache
  - Muscle pain
  - Sore throat
- New loss of taste or smell





# If you leave home, know your Ws!









#### Face Coverings

- Everyone who leaves their home or may be near nonfamily/household members
- Broad exposure to customers or employees
- Disinfection team members

#### Gloves only if:

- Perform disinfection of common surfaces
- Handle trash
- Handle food

#### Face Shields

 Not necessary unless you work in healthcare/manufacturing

# **Customer Interactions**

- Encourage social distancing
- Limit cash handling
- Encourage use of debit/credit, other contactless payment
- Add clear shields at point of transaction
- OPlace registers 6 feet apart with hand sanitizer/wipes
- Consider one-way isles
- Disinfect point of sale equipment after each customer (including pens)





- Stay home if sick!
- Conduct daily symptom screening of employees
- Perform frequent cleaning/disinfection
- Encourage use of face coverings for employees/customers
- Social distancing
- Obiscourage use of others' phones, desks, offices, etc.
- Provide hand sanitizer/disinfecting wipes in public areas
